



St James (Daisy Hill) CE Primary School Use of COVID-19 Catch Up Funding: Planned Expenditure 2020-21

Catch Up Plan Overview

The COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 resulted in the Government imposing a lockdown of schools. Children had to be taught remotely and school was only open for vulnerable children and children of keyworkers. This meant that there was a loss of learning for children from March 2020 until the schools full opening in September 2020. There was a further period of school closure from January to March 2021 which resulted in further loss of learning. The Government has awarded a catch up funding budget to schools to be used to address the lost learning.

Catch up funding at St James (Daisy Hill) CE Primary School:

Total Allocated Funding: £28 959 (approximately £80 per pupil)

Autumn 2020 and Spring 2021 Funding: £16 894 (plus £10 000 from educational expenditure, £3 400 from PTFA and £2000 donations to school for technology)

Summer 2021 and Autumn 2021 Funding: £12 065 (plus £10 000 from educational expenditure)

Main Barriers to learning - Emotional wellbeing; Individual identified learning needs; Engagement with learning

Aims Identified Areas from Loss of Learning

1. To develop and support the wellbeing of the children and staff
2. To accelerate the rate of learning for children to narrow the gap/s/lost learning as a result of lockdowns and school closures
3. To develop remote learning to ensure this is high quality and effective in the event any further school/bubble closure
4. To accelerate progress in the reading, writing and maths curriculum
